For the 2024 cohort, draft action plans are currently being reported. The 2025 cohort of schools has been selected, and work is now advancing.</p> <p>Construction of the Rainbow Road sidewalk and pedestrian path has been deferred to 2027 as grant funding was not secured. Staff plan to reapply for grant funding next year with a revised project plan that includes Jackson Avenue and McPhillips Avenue.</p> <p>Construction on the Pender Island Schooner Way Active Transportation Project Phase 1 is expected to begin in June 2025.
