Canada's airports expect cumulative revenue losses of \$4.5B by end of 2021

As travel restrictions and quarantines drag on into the fall, an updated financial outlook paints a dire picture for Canada's airports, which now expect to incur more than \$4.5 billion in lost revenue and debt levels increasing to \$2.8 billion by the end of 2021. The revised outlook, which represents a 30 per cent deterioration in expectations, was recently submitted to the federal government.






Monthly Revenue Comparison April – October 2019 & 2020






2020 Revenue, Budget vs. Forecast






2020 Operating Expenses Budget vs. Forecast

Airflow in Aircraft

Air travel and COVID-19 The risk of contracting COVID-19 during air travel is low. Modern airplanes maintain clean air by circulating a mix of fresh air and air recycled through HEPA filters, the same type of air filters used in hospital operating rooms. Air enters the cabin from overhead air inlets and flows downward toward floor level outlets at the same seat row or nearby rows. There is little airflow forward and backward between rows. 




Aircraft Manufacturers Modelled Transmission In Aircraft




