The SSITS is the host of the Tour des Iles Festival. This festival affords residents and visitors to the Salt Spring Island the opportunity to easily visit the other Gulf Islands. In turn, Salt Spring has visitors arriving from the other Southern Gulf Islands. The festival highlights local music, art, sustainable enterprises and nature. This festival is unique as it involves the largest five of the Southern Gulf Islands. This year, the festival is partnering with the Salt Spring Island Photo Festival. Each annual festival always brings island new and returning patrons to Salt Spring Island businesses. Other than the BC Ferry system, it is the only transportation system which connects the Southern Gulf Islands. It is crucial to a multi-year strategy in the creation of Gulf Island integrated tourism destination.

The proposed festival will take place for 3 days (June 21-23th) and will involve multiple artistic, musical and cultural events on each of the islands with lots of inter-island exchange of visitors. Land transportation will be available at all of the ports of call to transport participants to events.

Salt Spring Island will offer visitors: a multi-venue island wide photography festival, the weekly Saturday market, island tours, art galleries, Ganges shops and eating establishments.

The Grant in Aid acts as seed money allowing SSIITS to attract personal and business financial and in-kind sponsorships. Fare box funds also are critical to breaking even. Please see the attached budget.

3. Please describe how this proposal will benefit the community.

This project will benefit the community by connecting islanders, enabling a deeper and more meaningful exchange of community experience and contacts through artistic, cultural and related interactions. In addition to providing the transportation infrastructure the funding will enable the organizers to maintain and promote a calender of associated events and activities. For our purposes, events are things happening at specific venues at a specific time. Activities will also include unscheduled trail walking, biking, golf or disc golf play etc. This ongoing project also serves as an ongoing pilot project to gauge the desire for a more extensive passenger only inter-island transportation system. Feedback from participants and the knowledge gained by the organizers will aid in the ultimate development of a larger pilot project connecting the islands and potentially the Saanich Peninsula
