# **SUBJECT** Capital Regional District External Grants Update

# **ISSUE**

This report provides an update on external grants activity since the submission deadline for the previous report (April 12, 2019) through to the deadline of May 15, 2019 for this report.

## **BACKGROUND**

The CRD External Grants Dashboard (Appendix A) summarizes grant applications and calls in progress, as well as grants awarded since January 1, showing the projects still in progress.





### **Grants / Contributions Awarded**

Five (5) grants were awarded, totalling \$515,350:

- 1. <u>Community Resiliency Investment:</u> (\$100,000) for FireSmart and emergency response cross-training in the three Electoral Areas.
- 2. <u>Community Child Care Space Creation Program:</u> (\$214,600) for the Salt Spring Island Preschool Program space.
- 3. BC Rural Dividend:
  - o (\$100,000) for Southern Gulf Islands (SGI) Regional Trails Engineering Design
  - o (\$90,750) for Salt Spring Island Feasibility Study on Shared Services-Phase 2
- 4. <u>Infrastructure Planning Grant</u>: (\$10,000) for Salt Spring Island North Salt Spring Waterworks District Infrastructure Assessment

In addition, three (3) grant award notifications totalling \$888,900 remain under news embargo.

### **New Applications Submitted**

No new applications were submitted during this reporting period.

# **New Applications in Progress**

# **Partnerships in Progress**

One (1) new partnership launched during the period:

 <u>Settlement and Resettlement Assistance Program</u>: Under the leadership of the Intercultural Association, and with the support of the Regional Outcomes Monitoring Group hosted by the CRD.

# **New Grant Opportunities**

Nine (9) new grant calls were issued during the reporting period with deadlines as noted. Grant calls in progress for which the CRD is eligible to apply are featured in Appendix A (see page 6).

- 1. <u>Housing Needs Reports</u> (May 31 and November 29, 2019) for supporting local governments in undertaking housing needs reports in order to meet the provincial requirements.
- 2. <u>Community Energy Leadership Program</u> (May 15, 2019) for reducing GHG emissions, increasing energy efficiency, and stimulating clean energy sector development,
- 3. <u>Organics Infrastructure Program</u> (May 22, 2019) Intake opened for approved Expressions of Interest (EOI) to proceed with applications. CRD's EOI was approved to participate in the program's application phase.
- 4. <u>Ship-source Oil Pollution Fund</u> (Ongoing) to provide compensation for victims of pollution; thereafter, the Fund takes action against the polluter while protecting taxpayers. Local governments are eligible to submit claims to this fund.

- 5. <u>Infrastructure Planning Grant</u> (July 10, 2019) offers up to \$10,000 to support plans and \$studies regarding local government structure.
- 6. <u>CleanBC Building Innovation Fund</u> (July 31, 2019) provides funding to promote building sector innovation in three streams: research, commercialization, demonstration of energy efficient and low-carbon building solutions to build industry capacity and public acceptance.
- 7. <u>Community Emergency Preparedness Fund</u> (November 15, 2019) to build the resiliency of volunteer and composite fire departments through the purchase of new or replacement equipment, and to facilitate the delivery of training and exercises.
- 8. <u>BC Rural Dividend 6<sup>th</sup> Intake</u> (August 15, 2019) assists unincorporated areas with a population of 25,000 people or less reinvigorate and diversity their economies.
- 9. <u>Sustainable Development Goals Funding Program</u> (Ongoing until program intake objectives are met) up to \$100,000 for projects that assist in achieving goals set out by the United Nations Member States 2030 Agenda for sustainable development.

- 1. Food Security Provincial Initiatives Fund Details to be released late June 2019.
- 2. BC Rural Dividend Program Continuing to 2021-2022.
