We are aiming to fundraise for 25,000 in total which covers the bare minimum of what we desperately need. We have attached some examples of the equipment that we need to purchase, to illustrate cost.

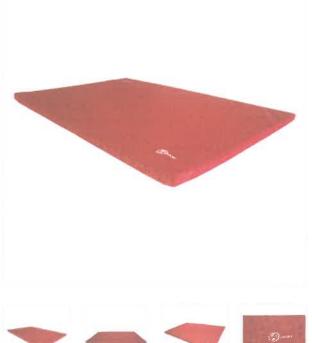

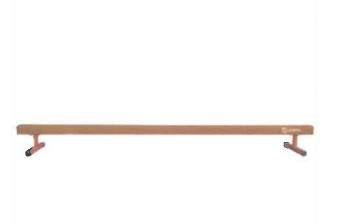

SWOVA has worked for more than two decades to address violence in all forms. SWOVA's relationship education programs bring both males and females together to identify/address issues of violence. There is the Peace Kids program for students in grades 3-5, the Respect Project for students in middle school and the after school Pass-It-On mentoring program. These programs are delivered in collaboration with School District #64 and align with the Ministry of Education core competencies. These programs help the students of our community to build social and emotional learning skills to support their mental health and social well-being. SWOVA also hosts a number of community awareness events over the year. These include a candlelight vigil to remember the 14 women killed in Montreal on December 6th 1989 as well as an annual International Women's Day event every March.

2. Describe the geographic area that receives services or benefits from your organization.

Both the in-school and after-school programming delivered by SWOVA benefits students of SD#64. SWOVA has served all four elementary schools on SSI as well as SIMS and GISS. When funding permits, the programs have travelled to the outer Gulf Islands. SWOVA offers training of its programs to other communities.

The Pass-It-On Program is an after school program that provides both structured and individual mentorship between high school youth and grade 8 students throughout the academic year. Community connections are made by bringing in adults who serve as important mentors and role models. There is a Pass-It-On Girls and a Pass-It-On Boys program. This is a prevention program that focusses on growing social-emotional and leadership skills. Through the program, boys and girls aged 13-17 form relationships that will be of benefit to them in their immediate lives and in their future. Grade 8s get the benefit of the program aiding their transition to the high school. High school students gain opportunities to develop their leadership capacity, through skills training and the chance to organize youth-driven initiatives such as Sparkfest.

SWOVA has received a 4-year capacity building grant for the purpose of developing its social enterprise. This work requires a bigger investment in each program over the coming year to engage in thoughtful evaluation, review and redesign so that they can be packaged to sell. The Pass-It-On program is currently falling short in terms of funds for delivery. This is a rate-limiting step that stalls any forward movement towards a new revenue-stream that will eventually help the program be self-sustaining.

3. Please describe how this proposal will benefit the community.

Our past research and knowledge tells us that 1) targeting prevention education, 2) increasing social/emotional competencies and 3) building leadership skills in youth leads to increased overall well-being and long-term positive outcomes, including an improvement in the quality of life of communities as a whole. Many of the students benefitting from our programs are at-risk and vulnerable because of the nature of our community. We know this through strong anecdotal and experiential information but also through several data sources that paint the bigger picture. These data sources include the impacts of the living wage on GI families, the child vulnerability rate and the high school completion rate. These realities are coupled with the remote and rural nature of our community with access to information not as readily available and resources/services not as comprehensive as they would be in a larger center. SWOVA programs help to mitigate the effect of these risk factors.
