Supporting our Nurse Practitioner program

Dear Chairs,

The Victoria Health Co-operative was established in 2010 to provide wellness and health programs to its member-owners and the wider community. We know there is a serious shortage of doctors in the region. Our data shows that there are many residents without access to Primary Health Care. Nurse Practitioners go far towards filling the gap. We have a partial solution and need the assistance of the Capital Regional Hospital District to bring it into action for maximum community benefit.

Thanks to the hard work of the BC Association of Community Health Centres, President Grey Showler of Cool Aid, we have received Funding of \$212,588 from the Ministry of Health for a Nurse Practitioner and RN or Medical Office Assistant. This will cover either part-time salary or salary that is full-time but only for a short period. Nor does it cover overhead such as adaptation of exam rooms, and provision furniture and equipment, EMR, insurance etc.

To meet these outstanding needs, we have:

- arranged for access to two rooms at the Cook Street Village Activity Centre, two days per week subject to finalization of CSVAC access to additional space, rent free
- access to a room at Centennial United Church one day or two per week, at minimal rent
- weekly access to the existing medical exam room at Our Place, rent free
- recognized that time should also be allowed for home visits
- very gratefully received a commitment, from the United Church for a \$131,000 ProVision grant.

To fully utilize the existing funding we need to adapt, furnish and equip the spaces at Cook Street Village Activity Centre and Centennial United Church, and provide disposables, office support, and insurance for up to thirty months (the anticipated start of fully supported, full-time funding):

- we have launched a fund-raising program through the Creating Community Wellness Charity
- are applying to the Gaming Commission for funds for furniture and equipment
- are applying to the federal New Horizons for Seniors fund to support wellness education
- are applying to the Victoria Foundation re their support for medical programs

Of the total budget, attached, of \$547,580, we have received or have commitment of \$343,588. We request \$61,198 support from the Capital Regional District Hospital Board, 30% of the costs not yet covered, to maximize the community health benefits of the amounts already committed.
