
CONNECTIONS South Island Mobility Plan

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
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



Transportation Snapshot Highlights Transportation Challenges for First Nations



Conversations with First Nations Communities:

- Walking and cycling are primary modes.
- Safety is a top priority.
- Lack of travel options is a barrier
- Barriers to Cowichan Connector transit service cost, limited schedule, poor connection to local transit.
- Local transit generally not meeting needs (schedule, frequency and connections).
- Economic development and climate change are key goals.

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


Goals & Provincial Strategies

GOAL #1 ENSURING SUSTAINABLE MULTI-MODAL TRAVEL OPTIONS

Sustainability will be accomplished through multiple strategies intended to support and encourage people to take transit, walk and/or bike as well as strategies to accelerate the move from gasoline powered transport to electric vehicles.

- Encourage growth and densification in designated Urban Centres
- Advance TDM policies & incentives for sustainable travel in Urban Centres
- Support and implement bus lanes on highways and other inter-regional service corridors
- Implement transit priority treatments at intersections along highways
- Support provision of strategically located transit exchanges and Park and Ride lots
- Expand provincial programs of adding charging stations
- Policies and support infrastructure to increase use of energy efficient vehicles and alternative fuels
- Support BC Transit's Low Carbon Fleet Program to change its entire fleet to electric vehicles





Goals & Provincial Strategies

GOAL #2 STRENGTHEN INTERMODAL CONNECTIONS

Integrating travel will be accomplished by identifying the missing links that prevent or discourage people from using sustainable choices and partner with others to close those gaps. This will include addressing the so-called 'first and last mile' shortcomings within the region.

- Connect communities in the South Island, including First Nations communities
- Support attractive inter-modal connections at mobility hubs serving inter-regional travel
- Implement policies and regulations to support new forms of mobility for sustainable choices
- Add secure bike parking/storage at key locations
- Implement policies to advance and support ride hailing
- Pursuit of mobility as a service (MaaS)



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Goals & Provincial Strategies

GOAL #3 IMPROVE SAFETY AND RELIABILITY

The safety and reliability of inter-regional travel will be addressed through improvements that target high crash locations and upgrades that improve travel times for transit and general-purpose traffic.

- Implement highway safety and reliability improvements
- Improve network connectivity and redundancy
- Implement facilities that support sustainable modes and goods movement





Goals & Provincial Strategies

GOAL #4 SUPPORT AND ENCORAGE ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION

Support for active transportation will primarily be accomplished with financial partnerships to establish and improve active transportation infrastructure as well as identifying gaps in inter-regional networks.

- Expanded funding for regional active transportation priorities.
- Implement active transportation facilities along corridors serving inter-regional travel.
- Support upgrades to active transportation facilities and crossings of highways.
- Establish targeted funding to improve intersection accessibility on urban highways.
- Encourage and support regional policies and directions for incentives for sustainable modes of transportation serving designated Urban Centres and Gateways.
- Improvements to address comfort/safety of active transportation crossing highways around key urban centres.






#1 – Core Area

- d. Support planning around other regional-serving travel (i.e. marine, rail, etc.).






#3 – Malahat / CVRD
