The most likely wildland fire potential comes from Gowland Tod Provincial Park, and even more so, Mt Work Regional Park (CRD park), where large numbers of people visit from throughout the region on a daily basis during the summer fire season. This water tank infrastructure will provide added capacity to address the most critical part of preventing a major fire disaster; that is, having sufficient water storage to quickly extinguish a small fire before it spreads.
